The Mission's CEO Visits Liberia

The Kuwaa Mission's (KM) CEO. Rev. Dr. D. Jensen Seyenkulo was in Liberia for the month of April. Jensen traveled to Liberia for four main reasons: 1) visit with field workers, 2) visit mission projects, 3) enhance the mission's relationship with the Liberian government and 4) secure the mission's collaboration with other Non-governmental organizations (NGO) in the country.

These projects are needed to combat the malnutrition endemic in the region.

After using the water filters for over a year, they have realized what positive effects safe drinking water can have on them and their children's future. Clinic Project

NGO that has brought great In the April issue of the Prayer Letter we reported on the need for a medical facility in the region. Among the reasons given in that issue are the facts that the closest hospital to the Kuwaa people is at least 80 miles away and due to the lack of motor roads, patients and women in complicated labor pain have to be carried in hammocks on foot for days in order to get to a medical facility. The donation of Lord of Life of North Pole, AK has motivated our field workers and villagers to work tirelessly to see that a clinic facility is a reality in the region. Villagers have molded 6000 mud and straw blocks and dug sand for the clinic.
