Dear Friends: It isn't easy to be a volunteer missionary. There are cultural and language adjustments to face. There is remote village living and eating a totally new diet. BUT there are few more rewarding adventures in life – to go help another group of Christian brothers and sisters who desperately need help. It requires sacrifice. It requires commitment. It requires a heart full of God's love and concern for all his people. *BUT* the adventure rewards with meaningful life. It rewards with satisfaction. It rewards with joy. It rewards with really getting hooked up with Jesus.



Short-term Missionary? I can't speak to you as a volunteer short-term missionary, but I can speak to you as a long term missionary who lived and worked in one of these remote areas. I loved every minute of the experience! The experience was exhilarating. It was rewarding. It gave me a whole new caring family who continues to love me and my family. We became

A Team of Volunteers: One of the Lutheran congregations in the US wants to put together a team or more of volunteers to go to the Kuwaa Chiefdom to help them help themselves after so much suffering and loss due to the 12 year civil war. They need so much help. They need you to go and teach VBS or adult Bible studies. They need you to go and roll up your sleeves to help with work projects like putting in wells and pumps. They need you to go to help rebuild or build a clinic, a church building, or a school. The school teachers need training at a much lower level than is required here. They need personnel to do medical clinic work and to help train indigenous medical personnel in the Chiefdom. The town pastors and evangelists need training in theological, contextualize preaching,

one big happy family. More and indigenization of their church.

Can I go?

I would definitely go, but my health and body won't allow me the opportunity. However, I can recruit others to go and help our Christian Kuwaa brothers and sisters.
