By Cindy Ellis Have you ever been put in a difficult situation and wondered how you would ever get through it? Most of us have at some time in our lives. We feel that we only made it by the Grace of God. That is how I felt many times on my two recent visits to Kuwaa Land.



Last year, I walked about $100 \ \mathrm{miles}$ through the jungle, Spreading the Word to visit 14 of the 16 Kuwaa villages, bringing them hope, water filters, wells, school supplies, Good News, and HOPE! It was physically demanding, and I'm not an athlete! I crossed over 100 log bridges, stomped on thousands of ants, ate bush meat such as antelope, boar, hippo, bush cow, and survived to tell my story. It was only by the Grace of God that I made it! I thank all of you for your prayers.

I'm making preparations now to return on March 3, for one month. Again, I need your prayers. Please pray that I am able to accomplish the work that we set out The Kuwaa People have to do. Pray for my safety and health. When I come back. I'll share some stories with you.

and beyond their normal routine to help themselves. Their days are very full, just in surviving. With our help, however, they feel inspired to go even further to help build schools, clinics, and Mission. We need people to churches, and to help each other. They are strong and willing workers, but they lack materials for building projects.

Coffee Clatch for Kuwaa

is a group that raises funds and awareness of the Kuwaa women's needs. This year, Coffee Clatch donations will provide supplies for midwives. They need latex gloves, disinfectant, scissors (to cut the cord!), clamps, and plastic sheets to lay on the dirt floor.



Last year, Cindy witnessed a woman in childbirth. The midwives had only one old pair of latex gloves, with holes in them. The woman giving birth was lying on the dirt floor or pacing back and forth, and the midwives were tenderly rubbing her belly and her back. In the corner of the room, someone was cooking over an open wood fire. They had no supplies, but they cared for the woman as best they could. Their care and concern for her was all she had. And, by the Grace of God, she delivered a healthy baby!
